982d SIGNAL COMPANY

Constituted 15 March 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 982d Signal Service Company and activated at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey

Inactivated 17 September 1945 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Redesignated 15 July 1947 as the 982d Signal Telephone and Telegraph Operations Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 1 August 1947 at Columbia, South Carolina

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 1950 as the 982d Signal Operations Company

Inactivated 1 May 1951 at Columbia, South Carolina

Redesignated 26 May 1952 as the 982d Signal Depot Company

Activated 30 June 1952 at Spartanburg, South Carolina

Inactivated 1 January 1953 at Spartanburg, South Carolina

Redesignated 1 February 1956 as the 982d Signal Company

Activated 13 February 1956 at Rock Hill, South Carolina

Inactivated 1 September 1957 at Rock Hill, South Carolina

Activated 17 September 1994 at Jacksonville, North Carolina

Location changed 15 September 1995 to Wilson, North Carolina

Ordered into active military service 7 February 2003 at Wilson, North Carolina; released from active military service 15 June 2004 and reverted to reserve status
