Inactivated 10 November 1945 in Germany

Redesignated 7 July 1947 as the 122d Armored Ordnance Maintenance Battalion

Activated 30 July 1948 at Fort Knox, Kentucky

Reorganized ad redesignated 15 March 1955 as the 122d Armored Ordnance Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1957 as the 122d Ordnance Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1963 as the 122d Maintenance Battalion

Inactivated 15 December 1984 in Germany

Redesignated 1 May 1987 as the 122d Support Battalion and activated in Germany

Inactivated 15 December 1991 in Germany and relieved from assignment to the 3d Armored Division

Activated 16 June 2006 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina and assigned to the Combat Aviation Brigade, 82d Airborne Division
