Lineage and Honors

168th SUPPORT BATTALION

Constituted 1 May 1936 in the Regular Army as the 39th Quartermaster Regiment

Regiment broken up 1 June 1940 and its elements redesignated or disbanded as follows:

1st Battalion redesignated as the 68th Quartermaster Battalion

(Companies E and F redesignated as the 202d and 203d Quartermaster Companies, respectively; hereafter separate lineages)

(Remainder of regiment disbanded)

Activated 1 June 1941 at Normoyle Quartermaster Depot, Texas (less organic elements activated 1918-1940 at various stations)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1942 as the 68th Quartermaster Medium Maintenance Battalion

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1942 as the 68th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Battalion

(Companies A-D, 68th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Battalion reorganized and redesignated 4 November 1942 as the 3409th-3412th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Companies, respectively; hereafter separate lineages)

Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 68th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Battalion, reorganized and redesignated 1 November 1943 as Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, 68th Ordnance Battalion

Inactivated 9 December 1945 at Camp Myles Standish, Massachusetts

168th SUPPORT BATTALION

Redesignated 14 February 1966 as Headquarters and Company A, 68th Maintenance Battalion

Activated 25 February 1966 at Fort Campbell, Kentucky

Reorganized and redesignated 30 April 1968 as Headquarters and Main Support Company, 68th Maintenance Battalion

Inactivated 19 December 1968 at Fort Campbell, Kentucky

Redesignated 19 September 2006 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 168th Support Battalion and activated at Fort Sill, Oklahoma (organic elements concurrently constituted and activated)
