

# DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY Lineage and Honorz 729th SUPPORT COMPANY

Organized 17 March 1914 in the Maryland National Guard at Hagerstown as Company B, 1st Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 28 June 1916 at Hagerstown; mustered out of Federal service 4 November 1916

Called into Federal service 25 July 1917 at Hagerstown; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Reorganized and redesignated 1 October 1917 as Company B, 115th Infantry, an element of the 29th Division

Demobilized 29 May 1919 at Camp Meade, Maryland

Reorganized, redesignated and Federally recognized 28 June 1920 in the Maryland National Guard as Company B, 1st Infantry, an element of the 29th Division (later redesignated as the 29th Infantry Division)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1941 as Company B, 115th Infantry

Inducted into Federal service 3 February 1941 at Hagerstown

Inactivated 17 January 1946 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Reorganized and Federally recognized 27 May 1947 in the Maryland National Guard at Hagerstown

Converted and redesignated 1 March 1959 as Company B, 1st Medium Tank Battalion, 115th Armor, an element of the 29th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1963 as Company B, 1st Battalion, 115th Armor

## 729th SUPPORT COMPANY

Converted and redesignated 1 November 1965 as the 1st Rifle Platoon and Weapons Platoon, Company A, 1st Battalion, 115th Infantry

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1966 as the 1st and 2d Rifle Platoons, Company A, 1st Battalion, 115th Infantry

Consolidated 21 January 1968 with Company D, 729th Maintenance Battalion (see ANNEX), and consolidated unit redesignated as the 729th Light Maintenance Company; concurrently, relieved from assignment to the 29th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 December 1971 as the 2729th Maintenance Company

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1976 as Company D, 58th Support Battalion, an element of the 58th Infantry Brigade

Reorganized and redesignated 1 July 1986 as Headquarters and Light Maintenance Company, 729th Maintenance Battalion, an element of the 29th Infantry Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1992 as Headquarters and Company A, 729th Support Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2006 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 729th Support Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 1 September 2009 as the 729th Support Company, and location changed to Ellicott City

Converted and redesignated 1 September 2016 as the 729th Quartermaster Company

Ordered into active Federal service 26 December 2019 at Ellicott City; released from active Federal service 24 December 2020 and reverted to state control

Constituted 1 March 1959 in the Maryland Army National Guard as Company A, 1st Medium Tank Battalion, 115th Armor, an element of the 29th Infantry Division

Organized and Federally recognized 10 March 1959 at Hagerstown

Converted and redesignated 1 March 1963 as Company D, 729th Maintenance Battalion, an element of the 29th Infantry Division
