Lineage and Honors

394th REGIMENT

Constituted 23 July 1918 in the National Army as the 394th Infantry and assigned to the 99th Division

Demobilized 30 November 1918

Reconstituted 24 June 1921 in the Organized Reserves as the 394th Infantry and assigned to the 99th Division (later redesignated as the 99th Infantry Division)

Organized in November 1921 with Headquarters at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Ordered into active military service 15 November 1942 and reorganized at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi

Inactivated 29 September 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Relieved 29 October 1998 from assignment to the 99th Infantry Division

Redesignated 17 October 1999 as the 394th Regiment and reorganized to consist of the 1st Battalion, an element of the 75th Division (Training Support); 1st Battalion concurrently allotted to the Regular Army
