Constituted 1 July 1933 in the Organized Reserves as Company C, 664th Engineer Battalion

Organized by 1937 in Michigan

Redesignated 21 February 1941 as Company C, 757th Engineer Battalion

Redesignated 1 April 1942 as Company C, 757th Engineer Railway Shop Battalion

Converted and redesignated 16 November 1942 as Company C, 757th Railway Shop Battalion, Transportation Corps

Ordered into active military service 3 June 1943 at the Army Service Forces Unit Training Center, New Orleans, Louisiana

Inactivated 7 December 1945 at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey

Redesignated 23 March 1948 as Company C, 757th Transportation Railway Shop Battalion

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Activated 9 April 1949 at Milwaukee, Wisconsin

Inactivated 25 October 1951 at Milwaukee, Wisconsin

Activated 25 August 1952 at Milwaukee, Wisconsin

Redesignated 1 January 1955 as Company C, 757th Transportation Battalion

Location changed 23 May 1957 to La Crosse, Wisconsin

Reorganized and redesignated 31 January 1968 as the 1152d Transportation Company
