# **1742d TRANSPORTATION COMPANY**

Organized 12 November 1885 at Brookings as Company G, 2d Regiment, Dakota Militia, Dakota Territory

(Territory of Dakota divided 22 February 1889 into North Dakota and South Dakota by an Act of Congress)

(Organized Militia of South Dakota redesignated 6 March 1893 as the South Dakota National Guard)

Redesignated 9 September 1893 as Company G, 1st Regiment, South Dakota National Guard

Mustered out at Brookings by December 1897

Reorganized 16 May 1898 at Brookings as Company K, 1st Regiment

Mustered into Federal service 12-19 May 1898 at Brookings as Company K, 1st South Dakota Volunteer Infantry Regiment

Mustered out of Federal service 5 October 1899 at the Presidio of San Francisco, California

Reorganized and redesignated 22 August 1908 as Company C, 4th Infantry

Mustered out at Brookings 24 February 1914

Reorganized 5 March 1914 at Brookings as Company C, 4th Infantry

Mustered into Federal service 30 June 1916

Mustered out of Federal service 3 March 1917 at Fort Crook, Nebraska

## **1742d TRANSPORTATION COMPANY**

Called into Federal service 15 July 1917 at Brookings; drafted into Federal service 5 August 1917

Converted and redesignated 3 October 1917 as Company C, 147th Field Artillery, an element of the 41st Division

Demobilized 23 May 1919 at Camp Dodge, Iowa

Reorganized and Federally recognized 5 April 1922 at Brookings as Company E, 136th Engineer Regiment

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1924 as Company B, 109th Engineer Regiment, an element of the 34th Division

Inducted into Federal service 10 February 1941 at Brookings

Reorganized and redesignated 1 February 1942 as Company B, 132d Engineer Regiment; concurrently relieved from assignment to the 34th Division

Reorganized and redesignated 1 August 1942 as Company B, 132d Engineer Combat Regiment

Reorganized and redesignated 5 April 1943 as Company B, 132d Engineer Combat Battalion

Inactivated 31 January 1946 at Matsayama, Japan

Reorganized and Federally recognized 24 September 1946 as Company M, 196th Infantry

Ordered into active Federal service 1 September 1950 at Brookings

(Company M, 196th Infantry [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 1 September 1952 at Brookings)

Released from active Federal service 10 October 1954 and reverted to state control; concurrently, Federal recognition withdrawn from Company M, 196th Infantry (NGUS)

Converted and redesignated 15 September 1956 as Company B, 154th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 21 October 1959 as Company C, 153d Engineer Battalion

Converted and redesignated 15 April 1963 as the 74lst Transportation Company

## 1742d TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Reorganized and redesignated 8 January 1972 as Detachment 1, 741st Transportation Company

Consolidated 1 October 1978 with the 741st Transportation Company (see ANNEX1) and consolidated unit designated as the 741st Transportation Company; concurrently, location changed to Clear Lake

Consolidated 1 March 1993 with the 1742d Transportation Company (see ANNEX 2) and consolidated unit designated as the 1742d Transportation Company; concurrently, location changed to Sioux Falls

Ordered into active Federal service 11 March 2003 at Sioux Falls; released from active Federal service 9 March 2004 and reverted to state control

Ordered into active Federal service 12 December 2013 at Sioux Falls

#### ANNEX 1

Organized and Federally recognized 12 November 1956 in the South Dakota Army National Guard at Clear Lake as the 741st Transportation Company

Ordered into active Federal service 15 October 1961 at Clear Lake; released from active Federal service 5 August 1962 and reverted to state control

Reorganized and redesignated 15 April 1963 as the 2d and 3d Truck Platoons, 740th Transportation Company

Reorganized and redesignated 15 November 1965 as the 3d Platoon, 741st Transportation Company

Reorganized and redesignated 8 January 1972 as the 741st Transportation Company

Organized and federally recognized 29 September 1953 in the South Dakota Army National Guard at Watertown as 200th Engineer Company (NGUS)

Reorganized and redesignated 10 October 1954 as 200th Engineer Company

Reorganized and redesignated 15 September 1956 as Company C, 154th Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 21 October 1959 as 1st Engineer Platoon, Company C, 153d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 15 January 1962 as 2d and 3d Engineer Platoons, Company C, 153d Engineer Battalion

Reorganized and redesignated 15 April 1963 as Company C, 153d Engineer Battalion

Converted and redesignated 4 January 1968 as 1742d Transportation Company

Ordered into active Federal service 17 November 1990 at Watertown; released from active Federal service 26 May 1991 and reverted to state control
