Constituted 8 January 1942 in the Army of the United States as Company A, Supply Battalion, 6th Armored Division

Activated 15 February 1942 at Fort Knox, Kentucky

Relieved 10 September 1943 from assignment to the 6th Armored Division

Reorganized and redesignated 15 November 1943 as the 3577th Quartermaster Truck Company

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1946 as the 3577th Transportation Corps Truck Company

Inactivated 20 January 1947 in Germany

Redesignated 23 September 1948 as the 211th Transportation Truck Company and allotted to the Organized Reserve Corps

Activated 4 October 1948 at Monroe, Georgia

Location changed 1 November 1949 to Toccoa, Georgia

(Organized Reserve Corps redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 30 April 1953 at Toccoa, Georgia

Activated 16 September 1994 at Fort Ord, California

Location changed 17 September 2002 to Vallejo, California

Ordered into active military service 17 January 2003 at Vallejo, California

Location changed 17 July 2003 to Long Beach, California

Released from active military service 28 November 2004 and reverted to reserve status

released from active military service 7 April 2022 and reverted to reserve status

Element ordered into active military service 4 June 2022 at Garden Grove, California;  
released from active military service 31 May 2023 and reverted to reserve status

released from active military service 30 May 2024 and reverted to reserve status
