Constituted 31 October 1942 in the Army of the United States as Company A, 517th Quartermaster Truck Regiment

Activated 2 December 1942 at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi

Reorganized and redesignated 15 December 1943 as the 3941st Quartermaster Truck Company

Inactivated 4 December 1945 at Camp Shanks, New York

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1946 as the 3941st Transportation Corps Truck Company

Redesignated 13 February 1948 as the 250th Transportation Amphibious Truck Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 10 March 1948 at Los Angeles, California

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; on 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Location changed 28 May 1951 to Bakersfield, California

Reorganized and redesignated 1 January 1953 as the 250th Transportation Company

Location changed 1 May 1959 to Eureka, California

Ordered into active military service 15 October 1961 at Eureka, California; released 4 August 1962 from active military service and reverted to reserve status

Inactivated 29 February 1968 at Eureka, California

Activated 30 September 1975 at Fresno, California

Location changed 1 October 1976 to El Monte, California

Ordered into active military service 7 December 1990 at El Monte, California; released 18 May 1991 from active military service and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 10 October 2001 at El Monte, California
