Inactivated 15 October 1945 in Japan

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1946 as the 3360th Transportation Corps Driver Detachment

Redesignated 22 April 1965 as the 265th Transportation Detachment and allotted to the Regular Army

Activated 4 May 1965 at Fort Eustis, Virginia

Inactivated 22 June 1972 in Vietnam

Activated 16 September 1979 at Fort Lewis, Washington
