Constituted 1 May 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 329th Harbor Craft Company, Transportation Corps, and activated at the Charleston Port of Embarkation, South Carolina

Redesignated 21 April 1945 as the 329th Transportation Corps Harbor Craft Company

Inactivated 3 October 1945 at Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia

Allotted 24 April 1947 to the Organized Reserves

Activated 7 May 1947 at Tampa, Florida

Location changed 23 July 1947 to St. Petersburg, Florida

Redesignated 21 October 1947 as the 329th Transportation Harbor Craft Company

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 31 December 1950 at St. Petersburg, Florida

Redesignated 16 July 1952 as the 329th Transportation Company; concurrently withdrawn from the Army Reserve and allotted to the Regular Army

Activated 15 August 1952 at Fort Eustis, Virginia

Inactivated 15 October 2002 at Fort Eustis, Virginia

Activated 16 October 2021 at Fort Eustis, Virginia
