331st TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Constituted 1 May 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 331st Harbor Craft Company, Transportation Corps, and activated at Charleston, South Carolina

Reorganized and redesignated 11 December 1944 as the 331st Transportation Corps Composite Company

Reorganized and redesignated 9 January 1945 as the 331st Transportation Service Company

Redesignated 25 April 1945 as the 331st Transportation Corps Harbor Craft Company

Inactivated 15 January 1946 at Sand Island, Hawaii

Redesignated 7 July 1947 as the 331st Transportation Amphibious Truck Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 15 July 1947 at Portsmouth, New Hampshire

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 22 June 1949 at Portsmouth, New Hampshire

Redesignated 15 April 1959 as the 331st Transportation Company

Activated 11 May 1959 at Laconia, New Hampshire

Location changed 1 October 1959 to Groton, Connecticut

Inactivated 1 March 1963 at Groton, Connecticut

Withdrawn 22 March 1968 from the Army Reserve and allotted to the Regular Army;
concurrently activated at Fort Story, Virginia

Inactivated 15 September 1994 at Fort Story, Virginia

Activated 16 June 1996 at Fort Eustis, Virginia
