368th TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Constituted 26 April 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 368th Harbor Craft Company, Transportation Corps

Activated 8 May 1944 at the Seattle Port of Embarkation, Washington

Reorganized and redesignated 1 March 1945 as the 368th Transportation Corps Harbor Craft Company

Inactivated 31 May 1946 in the Philippine Islands

Redesignated 16 June 1947 as the 368th Transportation Harbor Craft Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 7 July 1947 at Chicago, Illinois

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 15 November 1950 at Chicago, Illinois

Redesignated 23 March 1966 as the 368th Transportation Company; concurrently withdrawn from the Army Reserve and allotted to the Regular Army

Activated 1 June 1966 at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland


