Constituted 3 November 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 3393d Quartermaster Service Detachment

Activated 15 December 1944 in New Guinea

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April 1945 as the 3393d Quartermaster Driver Detachment

Inactivated 24 September 1945 in New Guinea

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1946 as the 3393d Transportation Corps Driver Detachment

Redesignated 3 July 1965 as the 393d Transportation Detachment and allotted to the Regular Army

Activated 5 July 1965 at Fort Campbell, Kentucky

Inactivated 25 November 1968 in Vietnam

Activated 1 September 1969 in Vietnam as an element of the 1st Cavalry Division

Inactivated 30 June 1971 in Vietnam and relieved from assignment to the 1st Cavalry Division

Activated 16 September 1979 at Fort Riley, Kansas
