Activated 15 December 1944 at Camp Swift, Texas

Inactivated 20 May 1946 on Okinawa

Converted and redesignated 1 August 1946 as the 419th Transportation Corps Truck Company

Allotted 23 December 1946 to the Organized Reserves

Activated 20 January 1947 at Portland, Oregon

Redesignated 19 November 1947 as the 419th Transportation Truck Company

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Location changed 28 September 1948 to Grants Pass, Oregon

Inactivated 30 June 1950 at Grants Pass, Oregon

Redesignated 14 March 1963 as the 419th Transportation Company

Activated 15 March 1963 at Salt Lake City, Utah

Inactivated 1 October 1964 at Salt Lake City, Utah

Activated 10 January 1968 at Fort Douglas, Utah

Location changed 15 September 1972 to Salt Lake City, Utah

Ordered into active military service 17 November 1990 at Salt Lake City, Utah; released from active military service 10 May 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Elements ordered into active military service 26 November 2001 and 2 January 2002 at Salt Lake City; released from active military service 15 April 2002 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 3 February 2003 at Salt Lake City; released from active military service 17 October 2004 and reverted to reserve status
