464th TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Constituted 29 April 1943 in the Army of the United States as the 464th Amphibian Truck Company, Transportation Corps

Activated 17 June 1943 at Camp Edwards, Massachusetts

Inactivated 10 April 1946 in the Philippine Islands

Allotted 22 April 1947 to the Organized Reserves

Activated 1 May 1947 at Baltimore, Maryland

Redesignated 13 October 1947 as the 464th Transportation Amphibious Truck Company

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 29 August 1950 at Baltimore, Maryland

Redesignated 22 December 1955 as the 464th Transportation Company

Activated 23 January 1956 at Baltimore, Maryland

Location changed 23 May 1956 to Annapolis, Maryland

464th TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Ordered into active military service 1 October 1961 at Annapolis, Maryland; released 7 August 1962 from active military service and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 1 February 1963 to Washington, D.C.; on 31 January 1972 to Alexandria, Virginia; on 15 October 1991 to Fort Belvoir, Virginia
