Constituted 23 February 1943 in the Army of the United States as Company A, 507th Port Battalion, Transportation Corps

Activated 26 April 1943 at Camp Myles Standish, Massachusetts

Reorganized and redesignated 30 June 1943 as the 282d Port Company

Inactivated 25 June 1946 in Belgium

Redesignated 11 June 1947 as the 467th Transportation Port Company and allotted to the Organized Reserves

Activated 16 July 1947 at Jacksonville, Florida

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 1 March 1950 at Jacksonville, Florida

Redesignated 20 September 1994 as the 467th Transportation Company

Activated 1 September 1996 at Tacoma, Washington
