Constituted 14 August 1944 in the Army of the United States as the 489th Amphibian Truck Company

Activated 7 September 1944 in New Guinea

Inactivated 10 February 1946 in the Philippines

Allotted to the Organized Reserves 24 April 1947

Activated 7 May 1947 at Pensacola, Florida

Redesignated 21 October 1947 as the 489th Transportation Amphibious Truck Company

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Ordered into active military service 21 September 1950 at Pensacola, Florida

Reorganized and redesignated 5 December 1952 as the 489th Transportation Company

Released 25 February 1955 from active military service and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 1 October 1961 at Pensacola, Florida; released 3 August 1962 from active military service and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 1 July 1972 to Jacksonville, Florida
