## 991st TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Constituted 14 June 1942 in the Army of the United States as Company A, 385th Quartermaster Battalion

Activated 3 July 1942 at Camp Stoneman, California

Redesignated 31 July 1942 as Company A, 385th Port Battalion, Transportation Corps

Reorganized and redesignated 10 March 1944 as the 668th Port Company

Disbanded 25 February 1945 in France

Reconstituted 30 July 1947 in the Organized Reserves as the 991st Transportation Port Company

Activated 18 August 1947 at Statesville, North Carolina

Location changed 26 January 1948 to Salisbury, North Carolina

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 31 December 1950 at Salisbury, North Carolina

Redesignated 17 April 1959 as the 991st Transportation Company

Activated 1 June 1959 at Salisbury, North Carolina

Ordered into active military service 15 October 1961 at Salisbury, North Carolina; released from active military service 9 August 1962 and reverted to reserve status

## 991st TRANSPORTATION COMPANY

Ordered into active military service 11 October 1990 at Salisbury, North Carolina; released from active military service 7 May 1991 and reverted to reserve status

Ordered into active military service 24 January 2003 at Salisbury, North Carolina; released from active military service 2 June 2004 and reverted to reserve status
