(THE WORK GANG)**

Constituted 14 June 1942 in the Army of the United States as Company C, 385th Quartermaster Battalion

Activated 3 July 1942 at Camp Stoneman, California

Converted, reorganized, and redesignated 31 July 1942 as Company C, 385th Port Battalion, Transportation Corps

Reorganized and redesignated 10 March 1944 as the 670th Port Company

Disbanded 25 February 1945 in France

Reconstituted 30 July 1947 in the Organized Reserves as the 993d Transportation Port Company

Activated 18 August 1947 at Charlotte, North Carolina

(Organized Reserves redesignated 25 March 1948 as the Organized Reserve Corps; redesignated 9 July 1952 as the Army Reserve)

Inactivated 1 August 1950 at Charlotte, North Carolina

Redesignated 12 December 1962 as the 993d Transportation Company

Activated 15 January 1963 at Wilmington, North Carolina

993d TRANSPORTATION COMPANY (THE WORK GANG)

Ordered into active military service 10 February 2003 at Wilmington, North Carolina;
released from active military service 8 February 2005 and reverted to reserve status

Location changed 18 September 2006 to Palatka, Florida

Ordered into active military service 7 August 2012 at Palatka, Florida; released from
active military service 10 September 2013 and reverted to reserve status


